The Hawai'i Public Utilities Commission Establishes Solar Water Heater Systems Standards for New Single-Family Homes

HONOLULU – The Hawai'i Public Utilities Commission (PUC) announced today that it has established Solar Water Heater Systems Standards (standards) as required under Act 204, passed by the Legislature and signed by Governor Linda Lingle in 2008.

Under Act 204, effective January 1, 2010, no building permit can be issued for a new single-family dwelling that does not include a solar water heater system that meets the standards established by the PUC, aside from a limited exception. Thus, as of January 1, 2010, new single-family homes will be required to include a solar water heater system that meets these standards. As a result of Act 204, Hawai'i becomes the first state requiring energy-saving homes.

The Hawaiian Electric Company, Inc., Hawaii Electric Light Company, Inc., Maui Electric Company, Limited, Kauaii Island Utility Cooperative, the Division of Consumer Advocacy of the Department of Commerce and Consumer Affairs, Hawaiii Solar Energy Association and Honeywell International Inc. participated in a recent docket proceeding to assist the PUC in establishing the standards.
