

## Objectives





### Objectives:


- Identify ways to support equitable siting of energy infrastructure

## Equitable Access to Clean Energy

### Objectives:

Support equitable distribution of the benefits of clean energy to all customers

### Possible outputs:

- Recommendations for evaluating the equity implications of existing and proposed clean energy programs and policies
- Recommended modifications to existing programs to improve equitable access to those programs
- A new distributed energy resource (DER) or other pilot program focused on deployment for LMI and vulnerable customers

## Utility Performance and Tracking

### Objectives:

- Better align equitable outcomes with utility business models
- Establish ways to monitor utility performance on energy equity
- Incentivize behavior that will result in equitable outcomes

### Possible outputs:

- Community-defined metrics and outcomes for measuring and tracking utility performance
- Recommendations for designing and implementing a "LMI Assistance Fund"
- Modified or new mechanisms to incentivize utilities to improve measures of equity
- Identification of pilots that support energy equity

## **Key Terminology**

Term	Preliminary Definition
Energy Equity	Refers to the goal of achieving equity in both the social and economic participation in the energy system, while also remediating social, economic, and health burdens on those historically harmed by the energy system.
Vulnerable Populations	Those who are economically disadvantaged, certain racial and ethnic minorities such as Native Hawaiians, the elderly, rural residents, those with inadequate education, and those with other socioeconomic challenges,
Energy Burden	Energy burden is the percent of a household's income spent to cover energy.

The Commission is aware of parallel efforts by the Energy Equity Hui to craft Hawaii-specific definitions, and will aim to adopt those once complete.



## **Equity Tenets**

<b>Equity Tenet</b>	Preliminary Definition
Distributive Equity	Distributive Equity is recognized as sustainability programs and policies resulting in fair distributions of benefits and burdens across all segments of a community, prioritizing those with highest need.
Procedural Equity	Procedural Equity is the inclusive, accessible, authentic engagement and representation in processes to develop or implement sustainability programs and policies.
Recognition Justice	Recognition justice identifies who is being ignored in decision-making, and how that should be remedied so that all individuals are fairly represented and offered equal political rights.
Intergenerational Justice	Intergenerational justice relies on making decisions based on whether a decision would "increase rather than limit the development options of future generations.
