



Community Benefits Packages Additional Recommendations

#### **Evaluation Criteria**

- Change the weighting of price and non-price criteria so that community outreach plays a larger factor.
- Publicize threshold criteria (such as safety and community outreach requirements) and the scoring rubrics for evaluation criteria.
- Expand the scoring range for individual non-price criteria from 1-5 to 1-10.

- Reduce the number of non-price criteria by converting some into threshold requirements.
- **Consider including new criteria** or updating existing criteria to reflect priorities emerging from this series of discussions, including:
  - resilience,
  - project siting,
  - local economic benefits, and
  - community co-design elements.

### **Community Benefits Packages**

- Allow flexibility in how community benefits are calculated for a project, so long as the benefits meet the minimum threshold.
- Incorporate an inflation index for calculating the required amount for community benefits per project.
- Explore new enforcement mechanisms that can safeguard CBPs for communities in the case of project ownership transfer or other events that might put CBPs at risk.

- Incorporate the option for participatory budgeting for trusted community-based organizations negotiating on CBPs with developers on behalf of a community.
- Provide a **publicly available scoring** rubric for the community outreach criteria within the non-price criteria.

#### Additional Recommendations

- Create an equitable RFP procurement advisory group to assist the Commission in the upcoming IGP RFP docket.
- Create a pathway for community co-creation in the upcoming IGP RFPs by giving preference to developers who commit to piloting the concept of community cocreation.

- Enable earlier opportunities for community involvement in the RFP process and project development process.
- Provide preference to developers who site projects in preferred renewable energy zones, provided that community feedback has been obtained and is reflected in the developer's project.

### Long-Term Process Changes



## Long-Term Process Changes

#### **Community Co-Creation**

- Innovative idea that deserves fuller exploration while a more limited pathway is incorporated into the upcoming IGP RFPs
- Recommendation: Hawaiian Electric should pilot an RFP process specifically focused on upfront community co-creation, launching by the end of 2025

#### **Community Energy Boards**

- CEBs could play a valuable role in siting and development, but a clear model and guiding charter is necessary
- Several open questions and may require legislation
- Recommendation: continue developing concept and address in the upcoming siting and hosting track of the equity docket

## Additional Long-Term Recommendations

- Determine how to appropriately define "community" or "host community" for negotiating community benefits and/or CEBs.
- Enable a model for community ownership or partial ownership of community-based projects.
- Improve education and outreach efforts by the utility, the Commission, and other supportive agencies and stakeholders.

- Address the rural-urban divide in the siting and hosting of energy projects and infrastructure.
- Create alternative mechanisms for community benefits, such as direct bill credits, preferential rates, or higher credits for LMI communities.
- Develop a framework for legallybinding agreements with communities in lieu of CBPs.

#### Additional Ideas to Evaluate Further

- Create a mechanism to evaluate the effectiveness of RFP revisions and components focused on improving equitable outcomes (e.g., CBPs and community engagement methods).
- Evaluate how to provide benefits to communities who have hosted energy projects within or near their communities in the past.

- Develop intervenor compensation, training initiatives, and other programs to support community engagement at the Commission.
- Determine whether intervention in RFP dockets moving forward is appropriate and what procedural mechanisms require modification to align with this determination.
